Supply List!!

The supplies that you need will really depend on you. You get to choose what media you'd like to focus on. It can be entirely colored pencil, or entirely paint, or even only collaged paper, or even digital, or it can be a mix of ANY type of media.

There are a few things we will be doing as a group in class to have you experiment with new techniques, so you will need these supplies at home. Please note that if we end up going back face to face, students will need to bring all supplies to class with them to eliminate the use of shared supplies. These do not have to be brand new!! If you already have these supplies in your home, GREAT!!

REQUIRED SUPPLIES:

- 5. White glue (like Elmer's)

- 13. At least 1-2 colors of acrylic, craft paint, or even house paint
- 14. 8.5 x 11 Sketchbook

- 2. Kneaded eraser
- 3. Glue Stick
- 4. Colored Pencils (My Favorite: Set of 12 Prismacolor colored pencils)
- 5. Exacto blade or craft knife
- Construction paper assorted colors (Old scrapbook paper would work too)

I will be using CTLS to guide the learning classroom both synchronously and asynchronously.

Creating/ Producing 60%:

Throughout this year, you will develop a Sustained Investigation around a central idea of your choosing. This needs to be specific and on that you will not get bored with throughout the year.

We will be creating 10 artworks around this sustained investigation idea. 5 first semester, and 5 second semester. Along the way, you need to be documenting your progress with photos and your visual journal.

We will turn in assignments every 2-3 weeks and have an in-progress and final critique.

**All projects will be thoroughly researched using the visual journal.

Visual Journals 15%:

These will act as "process journals" to document your thinking, brainstorming, media exploration, experimentation, thumbnail sketches and planning for EACH project you work on.

Each project visual journal will be a 2 page spread, needs to have at minimum of 3 layers of media, AND visual journaling techniques.

Sketchbook/ Visual Journals: 15%

You will need to get or make a sketchbook for this class. We will be working in your sketchbook daily as a process visual journal to research your current assignment.

Also, you will be creating visual journals as responses to contemporary artists through the Art21 series. These Art21 visual journals well be due every 3 weeks. These can be on a single page in your sketchbook, but still needs to have a minimum of 3 layers of media AND visual journaling techniques: http://kellhighschoolart.weebly.com/ap-sketchbook-assignments.html

These can be worked on asynchronously each Wednesday and need to be photographed and uploaded onto your blog before your class begins on Thursday.

Responding/Presenting/Connecting: 15%

Responding: for each sustained investigation project, we will have both an in-progress critique and a final critique. You must be between 60 and 70% completed to participate in the in-progress critique and 90-100% completed to participate in the final critique.

<u>Presenting</u>: grades that deal with picking artwork for shows, prepping art for shows, creating an online art portfolio.

<u>Connecting</u>: grades that involve connecting what we are working on to history, other subjects, or the world around us.

<u>Ticket out the Door:</u> At the end of <u>EACH CLASS</u> <u>PERIOD</u>, you will take a photo of whatever you got done in class that day and send it to me through the Remind app.

Online art presentation:

Part of your presentation grade will be a collection of your work that will be required to display in a digital online portfolio.

- You will take photographs of all your artwork this semester. (projects, process images, and visual journals)
- 2. You will create a weebly blog to display and turn in your work.
- 3. You will send me a link to your online portfolio and we will have periodic checks throughout the semester.
- 4. At the end of the semester, this will be worth <u>2 major grades.</u>
