Altered Book (worth 2 summative grades):

You will be required to get a used hardback book with at least 50 pages to use as an artwork. We will be working periodically throughout the semester on experimental techniques that will emphasize the Principles of art.

- Unity (hidden text design)
- Contrast (Notan square)
- Rhythm (Op art line design)
- Movement (watercolor experiment)
- Pattern (stamp creation)
- Balance (symmetrical design)
- Emphasis (hidden niche)
- Cover design (your choice!)

Formative: 20%

Sketchbooks will be in this category. You will need to get or make a sketchbook for this class. We will be working in the sketchbook daily. Sketchbook assignments will also be worked on weekly and homework and should be turned in on Wednesdays. You will be getting a sketchbook handout with detailed instructions and additional images and examples can be found on my blog: http://kellhighschoolart.weebly.com/sketchbooks.htm

You can also get bonus points in this class by going above and beyond the work required in your sketchbook!

Other things that will be graded:

<u>Responding</u>: grades that talking about art (yours/others)writing about art, etc. These could be Formative, Summative, or Unweighted.

<u>Presenting</u>: grades that deal with picking artwork for shows, prepping art for shows, creating an online art portfolio. Summative

<u>Connecting</u>: grades that involve connecting what we are working on to art history, other subjects, or the world around us. Formative or Unweighted

<u>Ticket out the Door:</u> At the end of <u>EACH CLASS</u> <u>PERIOD</u>, you will take a photo of whatever you got done in class that day and send it to me through the Remind app. Formative or Unweighted

Online art presentation:

Part of your Summative grade will be a collection of your work that will be required to display in a digital online portfolio.

- 1. You will take photographs of all your artwork this semester. (projects, altered book assignments, and sketchbook assignments)
- 2. You will choose a digital platform to display your work. (weebly.com)
- 3. You will send me a link to your online portfolio and we will have periodic checks throughout the semester.
- 4. At the end of the semester, this will be worth 2 summative grades.
