PAINTING I EMPHASIZES INDIVIDUALIZATION IN ADVANCED DRAWING RECOGNITION OF UNDERLYING STRUCTURE COMMON TO ALL FORMS AND INTRODUCES COLOR WITH PAINTS. BASIC PAINTING TECHNIQUES ARE INTRODUCED. STUDENTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO EXPLORE WATERCOLOR, ACRYLIC AND TEMPERA TECNIQUES AND THE WORK OF RELATED ARTISTS. STUDENTS WILL ALSO BE EXPOSED TO A WIDE VARIETY OF CONTEMPORARY ARTISTS. GREATER SOPHISTICATION IN THE USE OF DRAWING AND INDIVIDUAL EXPRESSION IS EXPECTED. STUDENTS WILL USE A WIDE VARIETY OF MEDIA, TOOLS, PROCESSES, AND TECHNIQUES TO CREATE PAINTINGS THAT IMITATE THE REAL WORLD. SPECIFIC ATTENTION WILL BE PLACED ON FORMAL DESIGN AND COMPOSITION AS WELL AS EXPRESSION IN ART.

CREATING/ PRODUCING: (50%)

Main projects/ Large Summative Projects

Keep up with due dates! If you need extra time to work on a project please make an appointment with me, or work on it during LASSO. Only completed work will receive full credit. Work is evaluated on the basis of whether or not stated objectives and due dates were met.

Critiques/ Self Assessment/ Aesthetic Responses

Critiques may be formal or informal, oral or written. We will have an in-progress critique in the midst of each assignment. Feedback given to and gotten from others is a major form of growth in art, so these are VERY important. Self Assessment is required at the end of each unit based on the rubric.

RESPONDING/ PRESENTING (20%)

Students will be required to prepare and present at least one artwork for the art show. There will be an art show in December that students are required to attend.

Students will be required to present their work in the form of an online digital blog. Students will take images of all their work and upload them to the blog.

SKETCHBOOK/ VISUAL JOURNAL:

(10%)

Visual Journals will be due weekly and are to be used as process journals to help you with your current project assignment. Some weeks, students will be looking at Art 21 contemporary artists and documenting what you have learned in these journals to help influence your own art making. Visual journals need to have MULTIPLE LAYERS. Spend at least 60 minutes on each visual journal. These can be used as breadth or concentration images as well.

CONNECTING: (10%)

Art History Assignments/ Opening Slides

Class performance is critical to success in a high school studio art course. You must be prepared and be on task each class period in order to finish all tasks and assignments. You will receive a grade based on your level of performance.

LATE WORK:

If you are absent, it is your responsibility to ask for make-up assignments. If you are absent on any date a project is due, you should turn in the assignment the first day you return to class, NO LATER! If you are absent on the day of visual journal is due, then you will turn it in with the next one. (no late points will be take off in this case.)

Policies & Expectations

RESPECT: Be respectful of others, their property, and their artwork.

<u>PHONES</u>: Phones are to be kept off and out of sight at ALL times during class hours, unless you have permission to use them.

<u>FOOD/ DRINKS:</u> ALL food, drinks, candy and gum are to be kept in backpacks at all times. Spills ruin dreams!

<u>INTEGRITY:</u> No cheating or stealing will be allowed. This includes taking work (designs or text) from the Internet.

<u>PASSES:</u> Your agenda is your pass. No passes during "Dead Time" (the first & last 15 min of class).

- Understand techniques and procedures prior to using equipment.
- Handle all art equipment properly
- Report any accident to the teacher immediately
- Learn the location of safety equipment and first aid.
- Keep workstations clean and organized.
